Th representatives of the group briefed the parish council that the Appeal has raised £16,300 to date. There are two requirements: firstly, for playground equipment to the value of £19,500 and secondly, for a fencing around the play area requiring an additional £12,000. The volunteers will continue to fund-raise but are asking the Community Fund for £8000 to help meet the costs. There is some urgency with the playground equipment component as the supplier is running a competition which the KGV Toddlers' Playground Appeal could enter and if they win would gain significant extra monies for the playground. There are also some new donors who will contribute if the parish council provides a grant.</p> <p>After consideration EPC agreed to provide a grant from the Community Fund to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Provide £5600 immediately, to be committed to the playground part of the project, so that the group can enter the competition organised by Kompan and start to

	<p>move forward with the project.</p> <p>2. Get 3 quotations from two other playground suppliers if the group do not win the competition organised by Kompan.</p> <p>No decision on any grant for the fencing component of the request would be made until full details about the fencing proposals were shown to the parish council, and three detailed and priced quotations made available.</p> <p>Any grant awarded by the parish council must be clearly acknowledged by the recipients on the equipment for which the grant was provided. Recommended wording for the acknowledgement is "Purchased with funds provided by Effingham Parish Council".</p>
