#### MATTERS RAISED BY RESIDENTS

A representative from Effingham Playing Fields Association (EPFA) spoke regarding a disagreement they have with Effingham Village Recreation Trust (EVRT) and then went on to say that they wished to build bridges with the EVRT Trustees. They believe their association benefited local residents, and that they were working hard to eliminate complaints.

They also requested a meeting with all Managing Trustees. Cllr Pindar spoke confirming that matters between user groups and the EVRT were outside the Parish Council's remit as Custodian Trustee.

It was suggested by Cllr Cornwell that the Parish Council might act as arbitrator if needed. Cllr Pindar commented that he was willing to have informal discussions if that would be helpful.
